

Don't get me wrong, I was pleased by the simple information and the combination of drawn illustrations and actual organ photos.But the guy on the cover... what's with the Ken doll groin? Seriously, in a book about anatomy? If it's a modesty thing, put some shorts on the man. Otherwise

it's as crass as the clitoris being left out of vulva illustrations in early medical books. The formatting of the answers to section reviews is inconsistent, perhaps answers should uniformly be on completely separate page flicks. Also, one of the illustrations in the book is blank. Otherwise, wonderful.

Fabulous teaching tool! I like that all parts are labeled and then there is a real picture. It was easy for 2nd graders to learn and a wonderful tool for them to reference on their own when they have questions about their bodies.

This wasn't anything like I expected. Mostly, I thought since the title included the phrase "for Kids", that the language would be geared towards children. Definitely not so. For example, here is a quote: "Not only does the liver clear red blood cells and bacteria by phagocytosis, but it also manages nutrients and synthesizes plasma proteins such as protein C, globulin, and insulin-like growth factor." Really? This is supposed to be grasped by kids? Doogie Howser, maybe...

I didn't want to give this four stars, but the book is pretty decent. I actually ended up being kind of disappointed in the book because it was much higher level reading than I was expecting (my son is only 8, and this book is pretty intense for independent reading.)As a resource, it has a good wealth of information. As independent reading for anyone below, say, middle school, it's not really going to do the trick.

This is a very good book with a lot of in-depth information about human anatomy. I took off a star because I don't believe that the age range for ages 5 - 18 / good for grades 3 to 12 is accurate. The subtitle "biology for kids" would lead a would-be reader to believe that this is made for elementary school kids which isn't the case at all.I tested a few passages from the book on various readability scoring websites. Flesch Kincaid scores as well as other readability tests scored various passages anywhere from 8th grade up through 12th grade. I'd recommend this text more for junior high or high school students. Average readers in the elementary school years may find the book too challenging though very advanced readers may enjoy it.

I got this book free through Kindle. If I had paid for it, I would be very upset. Although it claims to be written for kids, it is not written in a way that is interesting or understandable for children (or for me). The illustrations don't usually show what is written - for example an illustration of the heart is labeled

with parts that aren't discussed, and the parts that are discussed aren't labelled. It uses words that are very difficult for children to understand, and the writing style is dry and difficult to follow. A great disappointment of a book.

This book is amazing! Both my 7 and 9 year old children find all the details interesting, and they learned a lot! There are some complicated words, but overall, a good, solid book about the human body for kids. I suggest having a dictionary ready to define some words as your child reads along. *Download to continue reading...*
